AWARDS POLICY

At GDGS MUN, awards are presented to recognize delegates and members of the Executive Board and Secretariat who demonstrate exceptional commitment, and excellence throughout the conference. All decisions regarding awards shall be made solely by the Executive Board, in consultation with the Secretariat where applicable, and shall be considered final.

The following awards will be conferred:

Delegate Awards

Best Delegate – Awarded to the delegate who consistently exhibits exceptional diplomacy, depth of research, quality of debate, negotiation skills, and leadership within the committee.

High Commendation – Presented to delegates who demonstrate outstanding performance and make significant contributions to committee proceedings.

Special Mention – Awarded to delegates whose consistent participation, well-founded arguments, and diplomatic conduct distinguish them during the conference.

FOOD & BEVERAGES

Refreshments and meals will be provided to all delegates throughout the duration of the conference. Delegates are encouraged to bring a reusable water bottle, as water refill stations will be available on every floor of the venue for convenient access to drinking water.

Dinner will be provided exclusively for delegates and faculty advisors who have opted for conference accommodation. Participants not availing accommodation are requested to make their own arrangements for dinner.

Any additional meals, refreshments, or networking events scheduled as part of the conference will be communicated to delegates in advance.

CODE OF CONDUCT

To foster a respectful, professional, and intellectually enriching environment, all participants are expected to uphold the highest standards of conduct throughout the conference. By attending GDGS MUN, delegates agree to abide by the following guidelines:

Attend All Sessions: Delegates are expected to attend all committee sessions and official conference events punctually. Repeated late arrivals or unexplained absences may affect award eligibility.

Use Electronic Devices Responsibly: Laptops and tablets may be used for conference-related work only. Mobile phones should remain on silent mode during committee sessions and must not disrupt proceedings.

Respect the Venue: Delegates are expected to treat the conference venue and its facilities with care. Any damage to school property or misuse of facilities may result in disciplinary action.
